COVID-19 ADVISORY FOR JUNE 8, 2022 PUBLIC BOARD MEETING

This is an advisory for those attending the June 8, 2022 public meeting of the California Privacy Protection Agency Board.

Please be advised that COVID-19 case rates have recently and rapidly increased in Alameda County, the physical location of the Board's meeting. In response, **Alameda County has reinstated a [requirement](#) that "everyone, regardless of vaccination status, must wear a mask" when indoors in many settings, including "government offices"** like the building in which the Board's meeting is being held. This is a requirement of Alameda County, not the California Privacy Protection Agency.

To minimize the spread of COVID-19 and reduce the risk of infection, the California Privacy Protection Agency **strongly encourages, but does not require, members of the public to join the meeting remotely via the videoconference or telephone options** described in the Meeting Notice and Agenda.

In addition to the Alameda County's [masking requirement](#), in-person meeting attendees are also advised of Alameda County's current COVID-19 [isolation order](#) and [quarantine order](#).

The California Privacy Protection Agency and the Elihu M. Harris State Building highly recommend following this guidance:

- Attendees do not attend this meeting in-person if they are experiencing illness symptoms that could be consistent with COVID-19, including fever, chills, cough, shortness of breath, body aches, headache, loss of taste or smell, sore throat, runny nose, nausea or vomiting.
- Attendees take an over-the-counter rapid COVID-19 test before attending this meeting. Attend by videoconference or telephone if the test result is positive.
- In-person attendees always wear a mask, preferably N95, KF94, or KN95. If an in-person attendee does not have a mask, one will be provided at the entrance.
- In-person attendees maintain physical distance and adhere to all seating and capacity restrictions.
