In addition, Dr. Nonnecke helps lead the UC 16 17 Berkeley AI policy hub, which is an intra-disciplinary initiative training researchers to 18 19 develop effective AI governance and policy framework. 20 Dr. Nonnecke's deep knowledge and understanding of cutting edge technology and policy issues is going to 21 bring a valuable perspective to our work to protect 2.2 23 California's privacy, and I very much look forward to 24 working with her.
