#### FEDERAL UPDATE

#### Reconciliation Bill – Al Moratorium

- Reconciliation Bill initially considered by Congress included a 10-year moratorium on the enforcement of state AI regulations
- CPPA submitted a letter in opposition to the House and, together with members of the Consortium of Privacy Regulators, to the Senate
- CPPA coordinated with members of Congress regarding opposition to the provision
- Al moratorium was stripped from the bill on the Senate floor in a 99-1 vote before the bill passed



#### MULTISTATE UPDATE

#### Trending updates to privacy laws around the US

(Based on bills passed in CO, CT, MT, OR)

- Broaden applicability thresholds
- Increased protections for minors, including prohibiting targeted ads, profiling, and sales of data
- Increased protections for location data, including limiting sales
- Modifying access rights, including requiring disclosure of specific 3<sup>rd</sup> parties that data is sold to
- Expanding the categories of sensitive data

#### CPPA Sponsored Bill – AB 566 (Lowenthal)

#### California Opt Me Out Act

STATUS: The bill passed the Assembly and is now eligible for a floor vote in the Senate.

Opt-out preference signals (OOPS) are a simple and easy-to-use way for consumers to optout of sale and sharing of their personal information

CPPA worked with many stakeholders and the author to address a variety of concerns about the bill

Bill will be amended to apply only to web browsers

Bill	Update
SB 361 (Becker) Data Broker Registration SUPPORTED	Amended to include additional disclosure requirements, including whether the data broker has shared or sold consumers' data to a foreign actor, the federal government, other state governments, or Al developers
SB 470 (Laird) Bagley-Keene: Teleconferencing SUPPORTED	No changes
AB 1018 (Bauer-Kahan) ADS WATCH	Amended to remove the opt-out right, allow an automated pre-use notice, simplify the evaluation requirement, and remove the audit requirement for deployers
AB 1064 (Bauer-Kahan) LEAD for Kids WATCH	Bill narrowed; now restricts deployment of certain Al systems to minors in CA
SB 7 (McNerney) Employment: ADS WATCH	New provision states that businesses not required to comply with substantially similar notice and appeal provisions related to ADS under other state laws
AB 1043 (Wicks) Age Verification Signals WATCH	Bill we are now watching related to age verification signals

#### **Bills for Board Consideration**

Two bills that directly affect the Agency

Amend the CCPA

Amend the Delete Act

Directs Agency to Act

Staff recommends taking a position on these bills

## AB 302 (Bauer-Kahan) Protected Individuals

#### **BILL SUMMARY**

Amends the Delete Act to establish a process for bulk deletion requests of elected officials and judges

- The bill requires the CPPA to itself obtain a list of state and local elected officials and receive a list of CA judges from the Judicial Council and submit requests on behalf of those officials to DROP
- Requires DROP to notify data brokers of these requests and to have them processed within 5 days
- Requires use of a secure and confidential exchange to develop and maintain the lists of government officials

## AB 302 (Bauer-Kahan) Protected Individuals, cont'd

#### STAFF CONCERNS

- CPPA not appropriate entity to generate and maintain list of state and local officials elected statewide
- Bill processes conflict with Delete Act's verification requirements
- Bill's technical requirements not feasible within the deadlines set

Staff recommends
neutral if amended to
change the Agency's
role and address
conflicts and feasibility
issues.

## AB 322 (Ward) Precise Geolocation Information

## Amends the CCPA to strengthen protections for geolocation data

- Establishes data minimization and purpose limitation requirements on the collection and use of location data;
- Prohibits the sale of location data;
- Establishes retention limitations on location data;
- Provides restrictions around business disclosure of location data to federal and state agencies; and
- Provides new notice requirements to consumers about the collection and use of location data.

Staff recommends a support position on this bill.
